Population

National

The Central Statistics Office (CSO) Census 2006 has revealed that there are now 4,239,848 persons living in Ireland. This breaks down to 2,121,171 males and 2,118,677 females in the State and is an increase of 8.2% on 2002 figures.

Leinster was the fastest growing region, with 2,295,123 persons residing in the region in 2006, a growth factor of 9% since 2002. Munster now holds 1,173,340 persons, growing by 6.6% to 2006. Connacht has a population of 504,121 growing by 8.6% while Ulster (part of) grew by 8.3% to 267,264 persons.

Regional

The Chart below demonstrates the increases across the regions of the State.

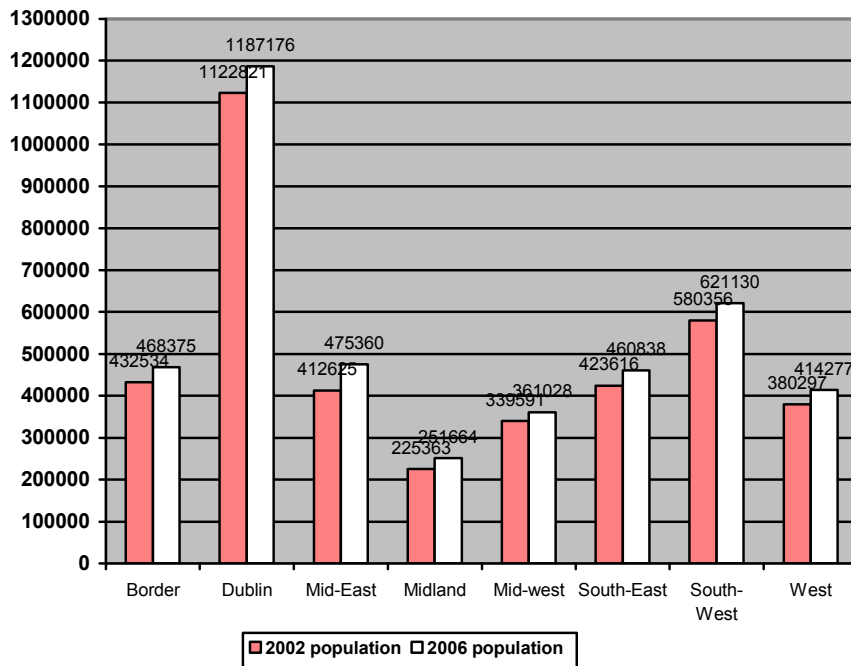


Figure 1: Population increases across regions

The Chart above demonstrates the increase in population across the regions of the State. The South East region is the now fifth largest region in the State.

South East Region

Within the South East region, Co. Wexford has grown to 131,749 persons and again had the highest growth rate of 13% in the Census period to 2006.

Co. Waterford has grown as a whole to 107,961 persons, a total growth rate of 6.3%. Waterford City has grown by 2.6% to 45,748 while Waterford County has grown by 9.2% to 62,213 persons. Co. Carlow has maintained its steady growth rate evident in the 2002 Census and has grown by 9.4% to 50,349 persons, Co. Kilkenny has grown by 9.0% to 87,558 and South Tipperary has grown by 5.2% to 83,221.

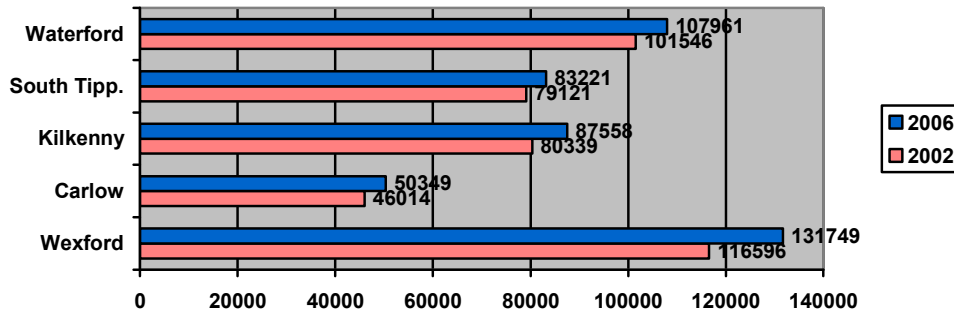
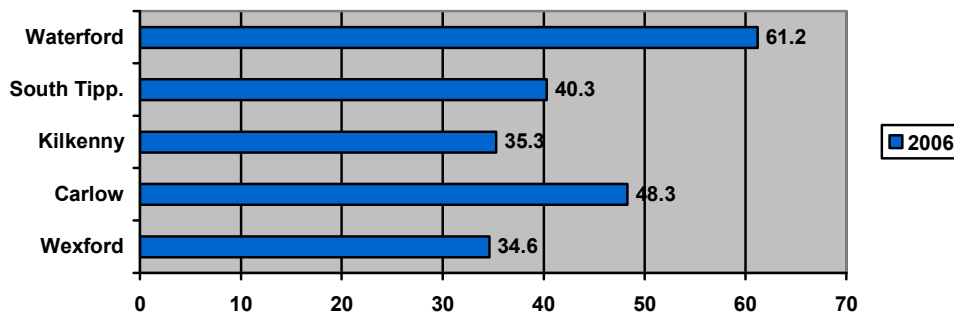


Figure 2. Population Change across the South East region

In 2002, 32.5% of the population of County Wexford lived in an Urban area, in 2006, this has increased to 34.6%, although this is still relatively low by regional standards, as can be seen above.

65.6% of the population now live in a rural area, slightly affected by the fact that the new Census towns of Bunclody and Castlebridge are now considered 'urban' areas as they have reached the threshold population level of 1500.

This is an indication of the slow urbanization and clustering of development that is happening around the county. Whereas the major towns are increasing in size, most of the population increase has occurred in the next level of villages and towns or in the wider rural areas.

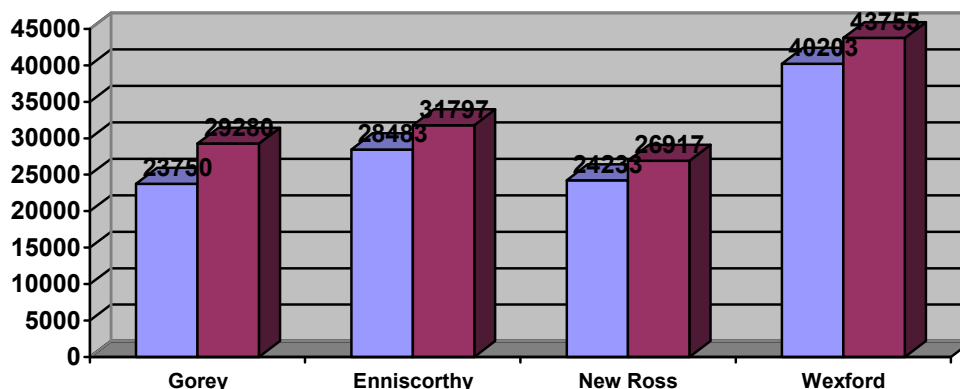


Figure 4: Population of County Wexford Electoral Areas

The Chart above demonstrates the Population of the Electoral areas within the County, with the Wexford Electoral Area remaining the largest Electoral area with a population of 43,755. Enniscorthy is the second largest electoral area at 31,797, followed by Gorey and New Ross with 29,280 and 26,917, respectively.

Wexford Towns with legally defined boundaries

In applying this limit, industrial, commercial and recreational buildings and facilities are not regarded as breaking the continuity of a built up area (CSO 2006)

While most of the major towns, excepting Gorey, experienced a decrease in population, the environs of all towns increased in population. The environs of New Ross (Wexford) experienced the highest proportional increase at almost 78%, the environs of Gorey increased by 69.4%. the increases in the environs of Wexford was 19.6% and was 21.1% for Enniscorthy.

Population of Census Towns

Table 2 illustrates the population of the next level of towns within the county, which do not have a legally defined area.

The table above illustrates the population changes across towns and villages of Co. Wexford. This further emphasizes the cross county increases that the county is experiencing, particularly in smaller villages and towns such as Castlebridge which grew by 60.3%. Courtown Harbour grew by 183% in the inter-censal 4 years, Tagoat by 91%, Murrintown by 43% and Bunclody-Carrickduff by 36.9%.

While some of these towns and villages have a low population base to begin with, this will further emphasise the impact of such a large population increase. The impact of large population

increases will undoubtedly have an effect on the social fabric, community, services and infrastructure of a small town or village.

Co. Wexford Areas

The following maps show the change in population in Co. Wexford by Electoral Division (ED). The Maps illustrate the numerical change in the population and also the percentage change in population across the county. A full breakdown of the population and population change by ED can be found in Appendix 2.

Enniscorthy Rural area

Moyacomb ED increased by 32.5% to 473 and Newtownbarry ED increased by 23.9% to 2326 people in 2006. Enniscorthy Rural ED had the highest actual increase with 1079 more people living in the ED than in 2002, increasing by 15.9%.

Gorey Rural Area

Ardamine ED increased by 1113 people or 90.7% in 4 years to a population of 2340 in 2006. The highest actual increase was in the Gorey Rural area which increased by 1502 persons to 4321, an increase of 53.3%. Monamolin ED increased by 43.4% to 658, an increase of 199 persons in the 4 years.

New Ross Rural Area

New Ross Rural ED increased by 1315 people (64.1%) to 3367 people in 2006. This was the highest actual and proportional increase in population in the area. Rosbercon Urban ED increased by 57.6%, 235 people.

Wexford Rural Area

Wexford Rural ED increased by 1437 people, 17.2%, from 2002 to 2006. Ardavan ED increased by 34.7%, 663 people in the Censal period.

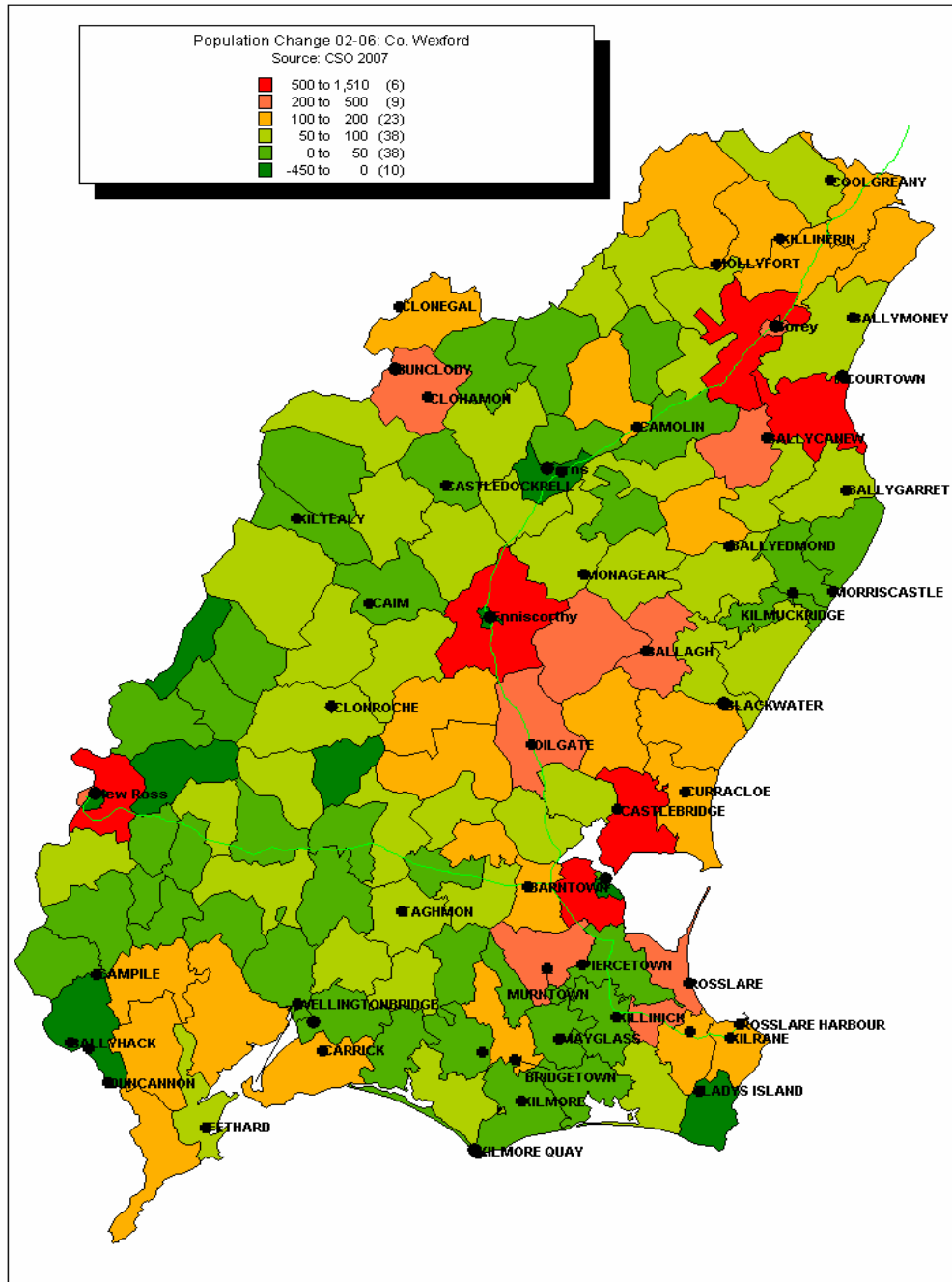
Map 1: Population Change across the County 2002-2006

The first Map gives an indication of Population change across the county from 2002 to 2006. The map show the increases reflected across the wider Gorey area in the north of the county and the wider New Ross areas. The connecting corridor between Enniscorthy and Wexford towns have also shown high population increases.

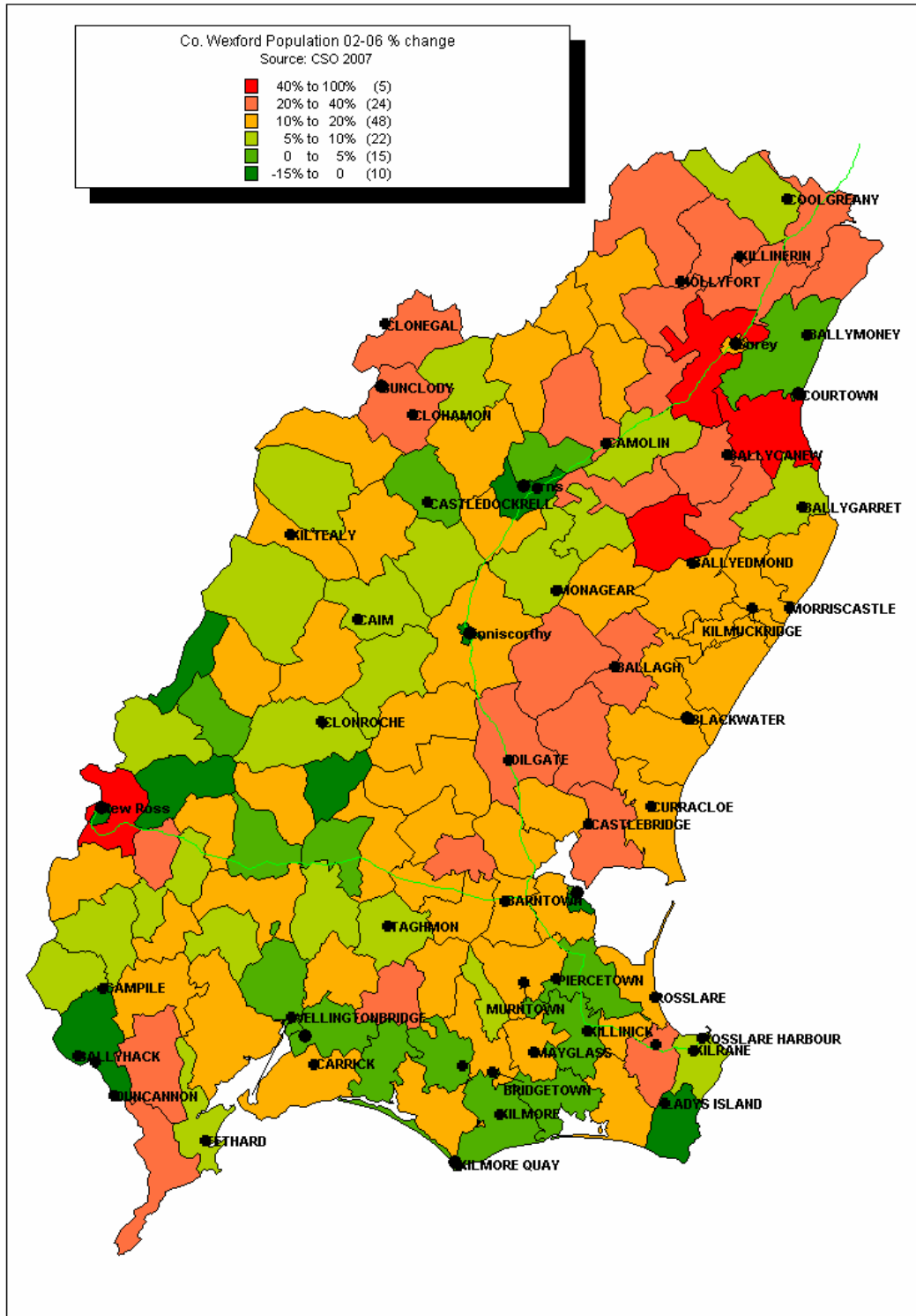
Map 2: Population % Increase across the County 2002-2006.

Map 2 demonstrates the large proportional population increases shown across the county with 77 of the 124 Electoral Divisions increasing by at least 10% in the past 4 years, 4 of these increasing by at least 40% in that time. This reflects the spread of population increases across the county, while still favouring the eastern side of the county.

Map 1: Population Change from 2002-2006



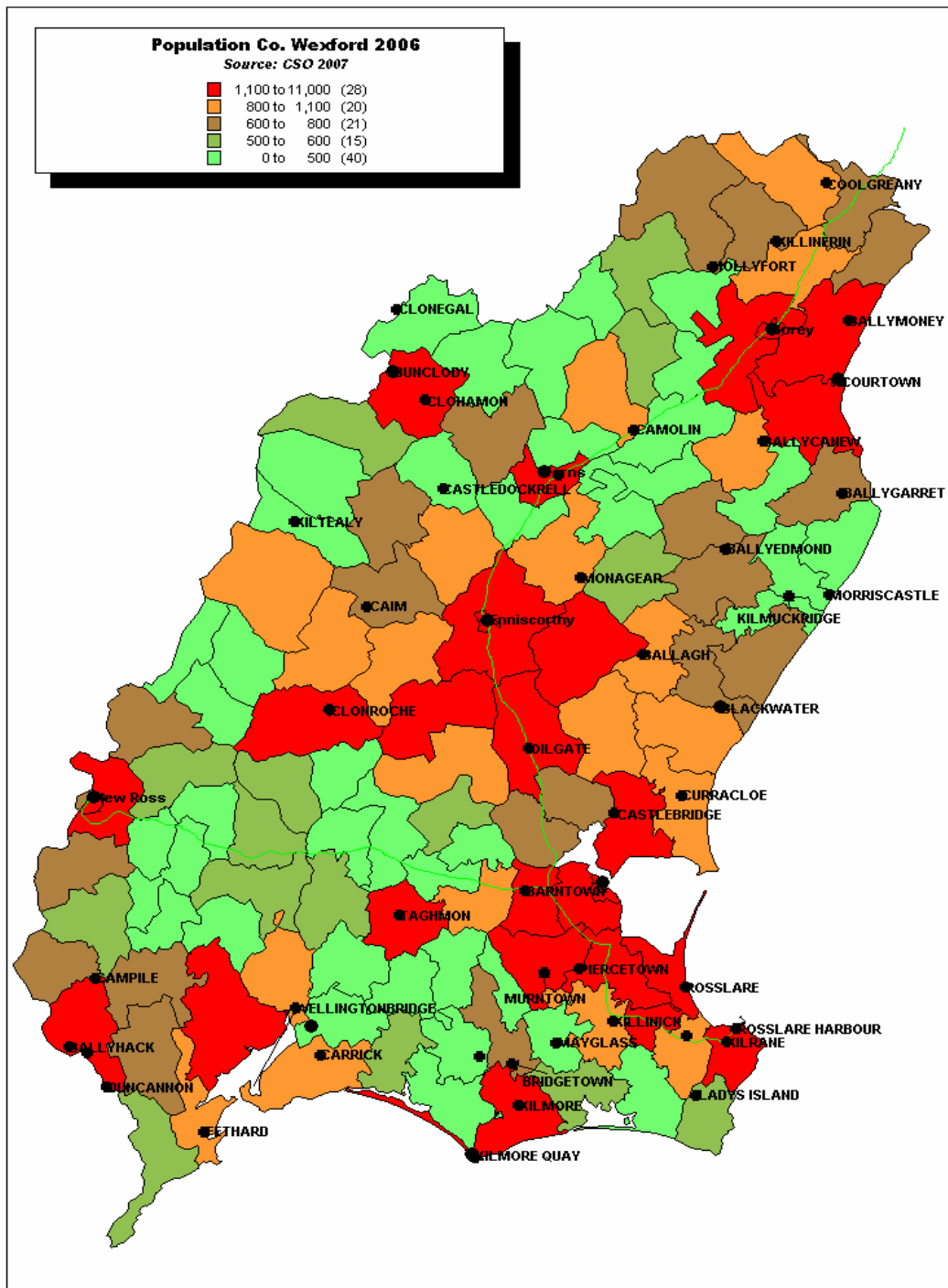
Map 2: Population increases across Co. Wexford 2002- 2006, % Change

Demographic Profile

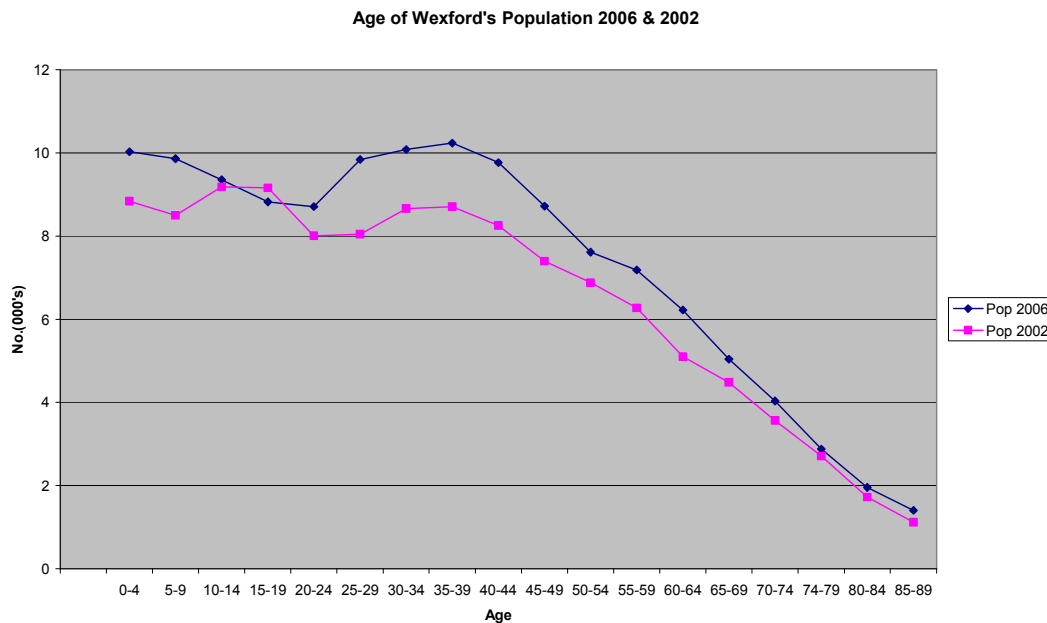
Marital Status

- ❖ 68,942 of Wexford's population are single which accounts for 52.3% of the total population. This is the same proportion as 4 years ago, despite an increase of almost 8000, in the number who are single.
50,888 of the population are married in 2006, slightly higher than the State proportion of 36.9%. The county rate of marital breakdown is 10.4%, this is slightly higher than the State's at 9.3%.

- ❖ Wexford has a significant amount of children under the age of 4 years- over 10,000 children in the county are under 4 years of age.

- ❖ Co. Wexford has less 15-19 year old teenagers in 2006 than in 2002 but from the age of 20 years onwards particularly up to aged 50 years, we have more of every age group than we had 4 years ago. The chart clearly shows that the majority of the inward migration to the county are people primarily between the ages of 20 and 50 years.
- ❖ 11.7% of the population of County Wexford are between the ages of 5-12 years (Primary school going age) in 2006, compared to 10.6% of the State. 8.5% are between the ages of 13-18 years (Post primary school going age) in 2006, compared to 8.1% nationally.
- ❖ The **Age Dependency ratio** is sometimes used to determine the demands on the working population- between the ages of 15-64 by the 'dependant population' who usually require 'outputs' from an economy and social system in the shape of more services, such as education, childcare, health and social welfare than the working population, who usually provide 'inputs' into the economy and social system of an area. The age dependency ratio is the combination of the under 14 years population and the over 65 years population expressed as a percentage of the working population, i.e. between 15-64 years.
- ❖ In 2002, the age dependency ratio of the county was 52%. In 2006, it is 51.1%, probably a result of the high birth rate and loss of the 15-19 years age group, despite the high inward migration of the 20-50yrs age groups. The State age dependency rate is 46%.
- ❖ The NIRSA (National Institute for Regional and Spatial Analysis) based in NUI Maynooth⁸, calls the 25-40yrs age group the 'Demographically Vital' age group. It states that an area with a high level of this age group will be more likely to sustain its population into the future. The NIRSA also state that as this age group are more likely to be wage earners, they can also provide strong benefits for the economy of the area in which they reside, provided the opportunities exist for them to contribute. In 2006, The Demographic Vital Ratio was 21.7%, in 2006, it was 22.8%.

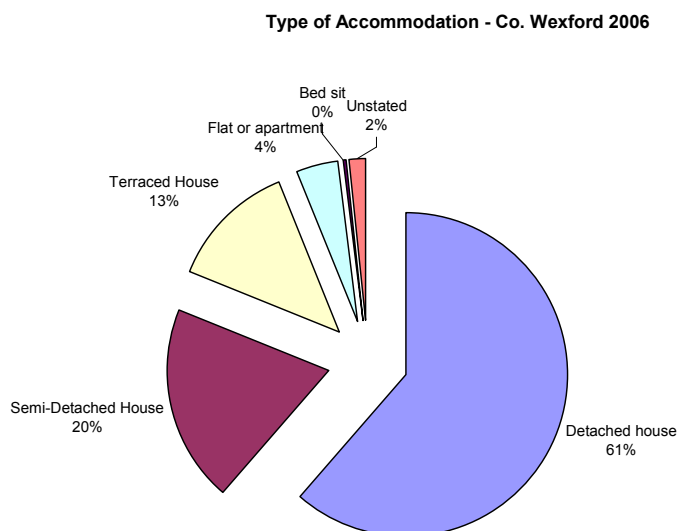
Castlebridge has the highest proportional youth population of under 14 years and 25-44 years reflecting the high commuting population of the area and pointing towards a continuous increase in population into the future. New Ross has the highest proportion of those between the ages of 15-24 years. Wexford Town has the highest proportion of those between 45-64 years and Bunclody – Carrickduff has the highest proportion of those over 65 years.

Households

- ❖ There are now 45,566 households in the County, in 2002 we had 38,011 of which 37524 were permanent, 487 temporary. 470 of households are temporary in 2006, 45,096 are permanent.
- ❖ This is an increase of 7554 (almost 20%) households in 4 years- approximately 1889 per annum.
- ❖ The number of persons per household has dropped to 2.8 persons per household, from an average of 3 people per household in 2002.

Type of Accommodation

The following chart illustrates the type of accommodation of the population of the county in 2006.



The type of household has varied marginally between 2002 and 2006. 61% of households reside in a detached house in 2006, compared to 62% in 2002. The proportion of households who live in a semi-detached house has increased to 20% of households, although this is an actual increase of 2107 in the censal period. The table below demonstrates the household changes from 2002 to 2006.

Holiday Homes

- ❖ There are 6,601 Holiday homes in County Wexford. 5,236 houses were vacant on Census night and 855 flats were vacant on the night. There is an overall vacancy rate of 21.5% for the County.

Travellers

- ❖ There are 1136 Travellers recorded through the Census in the county, equating to approximately 8.6 Travellers per 1000 of population. Of these, 873 (77%) are in permanent housing units, 209 in temporary housing units and 43 didn't state where they resided.
